Swimmers may choose to swim less than the 5 events, but the entry fee will not be pro-rated.</li> <li>8 and under - 25 yards of each stroke plus a 50 yard free.</li> <li>9/10 and 11/12 - 50 yards of each stroke plus a 100 yard free.</li> <li>13 and over - 100 yards of each stroke plus a 50 yard free.</li> </ul>	
	Coaches are encouraged to estimate entry times rather than sending No Times (NT)  The Meet Director reserves the right to limit entries, if necessary, to manage the timeline and number of competitors and spectators at each session.	
Entry Eligibility	<ul> <li>□ All swimmers must be current athlete members of a YMCA swim team. This meet meets the requirements of a closed YMCA meet in determining eligibility to compete in the YMCA Great Lakes Zone meet. All coaches must display the deck pass (wristband) issued by the meet host. Only coaches, swimmers, and meet personnel will be permitted on deck.</li> <li>□ Age is determined as of December 1, 2025.</li> </ul>

Competition Guidelines:	<ul> <li>□ The meet will be conducted according to the rules set forth in the current USA Swimming Rules and Regulations, the Ohio Swimming Policy &amp; Procedures, and the NEO/YMCA Swim League.</li> <li>□ This meet will be pre-seeded. There is no check-in for this meet, and there is no penalty for failure to compete.</li> <li>□ Heats will be seeded based on times and run slowest to fastest.</li> <li>□ 25 yard events will start off the bulk head. All 8 &amp; under swimmers must report to Clerk of Course prior to their event. 9 &amp; over swimmers will report behind the block.</li> </ul>
Deck Entries	□ Deck entries will be taken on a space available basis up to 35 minutes before the start of the meet and seeded as NT. No additional heats will be added to accommodate deck entries. Deck entrants should sign up at the deck entry table at a cost of \$30 per swimmer (includes surcharge).
Awards:	<ul> <li>Overall awards for the Pentathlon will be determined by the point total for all five events. Plaques will be awarded for the top 8 finishers in each age group for both boys and girls.</li> <li>In the event of a tie, a coin will be flipped and the winner will receive the plaque the day of the meet. A duplicate plaque will be sent to the other swimmer ASAP.</li> <li>Individual Awards: Ribbons will be awarded for the top 16 finishers in each event/age group in each event.</li> <li>SCORING: Points for each event will be awarded as follows from 1st through 19th places: 20, 18, 17, 16, 14, 13, 12, 11, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1. These points will also be used for the Poseidon Championship Series standings.</li> <li>Poseidon Series points will be awarded and posted on the PoseidonChampionshipSeries.com website within a few days of the completion of the meet.</li> </ul>
